
## **Voter Identification**

This map details voter verification requirements at the polls.



- **Minimum HAVA requirements in place.** Verification required of first-time voters who registered by mail and did provide verification with their registration application.
- Required of all voters; photo and non-photo verification accepted.
- Photo identification required; voters without photo identification can cast provisional ballots.
  These ballots are verified and counted based on state regulations. (See notes below.)
- Photo identification requested of all voters; voters without photo identification can sign affidavits and cast regular (non-provisional ballots).
- Required of all first-time voters.

*Notes*: Florida voters lacking required ID must cast provisional ballots. The canvassing board determines the validity of the ballot. In Indiana, if the voter is unable or unwilling to present photo ID on Election Day, they may cast a provisional ballot. They have until noon 10 days after the election to follow up with the county election board and either provide photo ID or affirm one of the law's exemptions applies.
